Certified Technology Parks in the Indianapolis Region:

- **City Way Certified Technology Park** (Marion County) is currently under development near downtown Indianapolis and encompasses The Eli Lilly Corporate Center and The Faris Campus (Rolls-Royce).
- **Downtown Indianapolis CTP / 16 Tech** (Marion County) is focused on creating a synergistic atmosphere for life science and technology companies. Linked by an elevated monorail, the community is supported by Indiana University Health (Methodist Hospital, University Hospital and Riley Hospital for Children) plus Indiana University-Purdue University Indianapolis and the City of Indianapolis. www.16techindy.com
- **Flagship Business Park** in Anderson (Madison County) houses the Flagship Enterprise Center (FEC), a 40,000 square-foot startup business incubator. FEC focuses on developing emerging manufacturing and electronic technologies and has strong ties to higher education and experienced business resources. - **INTECH Park** in Indianapolis (Marion County) is a 21st century business center with office, flex and R&D space of all sizes designed to support the needs of high-growth, high-tech companies. - **Intelliplex Park** in Shelbyville (Shelby County) houses Major Hospital's ultra-modern cancer treatment center, which serves as an anchor for future life science developments. The advanced Video Conferencing Center connects businesses to the global market. Intelliplex is supported by Ivy Tech Community College and Indiana Wesleyan University, which have satellite campuses in the park. www.intelliplex.org
- **Purdue Research Park of Indianapolis** (Marion County) is strategically located near Indianapolis International Airport. The flagship business accelerator combines a state-of-the-art office facility with resources and services proven to move emerging technology companies forward.
