Indiana Unemployment Rate Ticks Up Slightly but Well Below National Average

Indiana's unemployment rate stands at 4.1 percent for February and remains lower than the national rate of 4.7 percent. Indiana's Labor Force increased by 7,912 over the previous month with a 6,394 increase in employment and a 1,518 increase in unemployment. "Gains in Indiana's labor force participation rate are encouraging and further growth is needed to ensure Indiana reaches its workforce potential as a state," said Steven J. Braun, Commissioner of the Indiana Department of Workforce Development (DWD).

Indianapolis and Marion County's unemployment rates are .4 and .5 lower respectively than the rates of February 2016.

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


Residential Real Estate

Past Three Month Average for Indianapolis Region



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Indianapolis Region Cost of Living

The Indianapolis Region consistently ranks as one of the most affordable places to live and do business in the U.S. According to the National Association of Realtors, the median price of an existing single-family home in the Indianapolis MSA in 3rd Q. 2016 was \$164,100.
